MINUTES OF SPECIAL BUDGET MEETING
OF APRIL 7, 2009

CALL TO ORDER AT 7:10 PM

MAYOR BARSA STATED:

Adequate notice of this meeting was given to the press and posted as required. Date and time of this meeting was legally given as required by the "Open Public Meetings Act". This notice is on file with the Municipal Clerk and posted on the bulletin board. Minutes of this meeting will be made available to the public upon completion of typing and proofreading by the Municipal Clerk.

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2009 Municipal Budget:

Mayor Barsa announced that the Borough has received notification from an employee in the Finance Department that she is leaving to take another position. Mayor Barsa suggested that rather than hire someone, personnel be shared from another department. Chief Krapels has offered to share his secretary with the Finance Department. The consensus of the Council was to approve the sharing of personnel and to have the Chief's secretary work in the Finance Department for 3 hours per day. Ms. Neville, Tax Collector,

CFO/Treasurer suggested another cost saving would be that she resign the position of Tax Collector and the Borough appoint the Deputy Tax Collector as Collector. Ms. Neville said she would prefer that there be someone in charge in the department on a full-time basis and recommends the present Deputy Tax Collector for the position since he is already certified. Ms. Neville recommended instituting the change for May 1, 2009. The consensus of the Council was to move forward with Ms. Neville's recommendations and for the Personnel Committee to meet with her to finalize the plans.

There was a discussion on funding the \$6,500 for the fence around the Haring Cemetery. The Council will await legal opinion from the Borough Attorney as to whether Open Space Trust Fund monies may be used for this purpose.

Mr. Brizzolara offered combining the Planning and Zoning Boards to save money.


The consensus of the Council was to look at the cost savings if employees were given a two-week furlough or a one-week furlough. The CFO will prepare the numbers for council review.

The following are some cost savings recommendations for consideration:

1. Turning off every other street light
2. Closing Boro Hall one day/week
3. Funding overtime for special events from the trust account for celebrations
4. Fire Department agreeing to no donation for the Installation Dinner and 2 months of free rent
5. Cutting the Fire Chief's expenses of \$2,000
6. Not purchasing turn-out gear this year. Have an inventory of the equipment provided to the Mayor and Council
7. Sell ads for the newsletter to offset the printing.

There being no additional business, it was moved by Mr. Rapaport and seconded by Mrs. Orecchio to adjourn the meeting. All Council Members present were in favor of the motion. The meeting adjourned at 7:50 p.m.

MAYOR AND COUNCIL MINUTES
PUBLIC MEETING, APRIL 7, 2009**

The Public Meeting of the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Norwood was held at Borough Hall on the above date.

Mayor Barsa called the meeting to order at 8:05 PM and led those in attendance in a salute to the American Flag and asked for a moment of silence.

Mayor Barsa stated:

“Adequate notice of this meeting has been provided in accordance with the Open Public Meeting Law, P.L. 1975, Ch. 231, setting forth the time, date, place and purpose of this Public Meeting through a legal notice published in the Record and Press Journal, filing a copy in the Borough Clerk’s office and posting on the bulletin board.”

Mayor Barsa pointed out the fire exits and requested that all cell phones be turned off or to vibrate.

Public Comment on Agenda Items Only:

It was moved by Mr. Rapaport and seconded by Mr. Scott to open the meeting to the public for comment. All Council Members present voted for the motion. There being no member of the public wishing to be heard, a motion to close the meeting to the public was made by Mr. Scott, seconded by Mr. Rapaport and declared carried upon the affirmative vote of all Council Members present.

Presentation:

Mayor Barsa presented Certificates of Achievement to the 5th Grade Boys Travel Basketball Team for their perfect season as well as being the Air Force Division Champions. Mayor Barsa presented the coaches with certificates and thanked them for their time and dedication to the youth of Norwood.

Proclamations:

Mayor Barsa read the following proclamations:

“Autism Awareness Month”

WHEREAS, autism is a pervasive developmental disorder affecting the social, learning and behavioral skills of those affected by it, and

WHEREAS, autism was once thought to be a relatively rare disorder, affecting only one in 10,000 people, and

WHEREAS, as more and more health professionals become proficient in diagnosing autism, more children are being diagnosed on the autistic spectrum, resulting in rates as high as one in 150 children; and

WHEREAS, while there is no cure for autism, it is well-documented that if individuals with autism receive treatment early in their lives, it often is possible for those individuals to lead significantly improved lives, and

WHEREAS, The New Jersey Center for Outreach and Services for the Autism Community (COSAC) and Autism Speaks is spearheading an awareness effort in order to educate parents, professionals and the general public about autism and its effects.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT I, James P. Barsa, Mayor of the Borough of Norwood, do hereby proclaim April as AUTISM AWARENESS MONTH in the Borough of Norwood and urge all employees and residents to become better educated on the subject of autistic spectrum disorders.

“National Start Walking Day”

WHEREAS, each year 1.2 million Americans suffer a new and recurrent coronary attack, and cardiovascular disease is the nation's leading cause of death with direct and indirect cost estimated to be \$4348.5 billion of 2008; and

WHEREAS, more physical activity can help improve these statistics; and

WHEREAS, some adults may gain up to two hours of life expectancy for every hour of regular, vigorous physical activity, such as very brisk walking; and

WHEREAS, in addition to the possibility of increased life expectancy, regular walking has many proven benefits for an individual's overall health. Brisk walking for 30 minutes a day can lower both bad cholesterol (LDL) levels and high blood pressure. It may also help individuals who are overweight prevent weight gain, and reduce their risk of stroke; and

WHEREAS, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention estimate that physically active people save \$330 per year in direct medical expenditures; and

WHEREAS, on National Start! Walking Day, April 8, the American Heart Association's Start! initiative calls on all citizens of the Borough of Norwood to walk at least 30 minutes today; and

WHEREAS, the purpose behind National Start! Walking Day is to get Americans to become more physically active by walking.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, James P. Barsa, Mayor of the Borough of Norwood, in recognition of the importance of regular physical activity, do hereby proclaim April 8, 2009, as

“National Start! Walking Day”

in the Borough of Norwood and urge all citizens to show their support for walking and the fight against heart disease and commemorate this day by walking at Kennedy Field. By increasing awareness of the importance of physical activity to reduce the risk of cardiovascular disease, we can save thousands of lives each year.

Proclamations Continued:

“Support Our Troops”

WHEREAS, the people of the Borough of Norwood support the New Jersey National Guard and Reserve in the strongest possible terms, are immensely proud of their accomplishments, and are extremely grateful for their services to this State and the nation over the years; and

WHEREAS, in the highest American tradition, the patriotic men and women of the Guard and Reserve serve voluntarily in an honorable and vital profession by responding to their community and their country in time of need; and

WHEREAS, it is right and proper that we set aside time to honor these fine men and women for the sacrifices they make for every one of us; and

WHEREAS, the New Jersey National Guard State Family Readiness Council is honoring them with a concert by the Blawenburg Band at the National Guard Armory in Lawrenceville on “Support Our Troops Day” on Sunday, April 19, 2009.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the governing body of the Borough of Norwood, County of Bergen, hereby resolves that it honors these service members and the day of appreciation set aside for them.

9. A letter from Inter-religious Fellowship requesting permission to go through Norwood during their Sixteenth Annual Bike Bergen to be held on Sunday, April 26, 2009 beginning at 1 o'clock

Mayor Barsa informed that anyone wishing a copy of the correspondence could request it from the Borough Clerk.

Appointment:

Mayor Barsa nominated Mrs. Betty Bujas as an Alternate #2 Member of the Board of Health to fill an un-expired term to end on 12/31/2010. It was moved by Mr. Scott, seconded by Mr. Brizzolara to approve the nomination. All Council Members present voted for the motion.

Consent Agenda:

Mayor Barsa reviewed the items on the Consent Agenda and asked if any Council Member wished to remove an item. No Council Member wishing to be heard, Mayor Barsa requested a motion to approve the Consent Agenda consisting of the following items:

Approval of the minutes of the March 3, 2009 Regular Public Meeting and March 31, 2009 Special Pubic Meeting

- 09:68 Approving an Emergency Temporary Budget in the amount of \$2,283,044.64
- 09:69 Authorizing a fee refund to Mr. Andrew J. Marotta in the amount of \$25 for application for a Solicitors Permit he withdrew
- 09:70 Resolution of intent to appropriate funds or bond in the event of a funding shortfall/COAH
- 09:71 Authorizing competitive contracting for concession for Leaf Composting Facility
- 09:72 Approving the proposal submitted by Neglia Engineering for construction management in the amount of \$8,500 for the Kennedy Park War Memorial Project
- 09:73 Approving a one-year extension to the contract with Miele Sanitation for the collection and disposal of solid waste, bulky waste and designated recyclables

It was moved by Mr. Brizzolara and seconded by Mrs. Orecchio to approve the Consent Agenda. On the roll call vote, all Council Members present voted for the motion.

Committee Reports:

Prior to the Council giving their reports, Mayor Barsa congratulated Borough Clerk McMackin on her selection as Treasurer of the Bergen County Municipal Clerks Association.

Mayor Barsa also reported on the progress of the Livingston Street Beautification project by announcing that he recently viewed a new site plan that incorporates the paving of Jay Street with additional parking. The plan should be finalized and ready to submit to the County by the end of the month.

Councilman Brizzolara:

Utilities: Mr. Brizzolara announced that the BCUA will be conducting a free seminar on April 15 regarding the Sustainable New Jersey Program and way to conserve energy. The Borough of Norwood will host a presentation by Rockland Electric Company on Wednesday, April 15, 2009 at 7:00 p.m. regarding energy conservation and efficient programs. The public as well as the surrounding towns are welcome to attend.

Environmental Commission: Mr. Brizzolara announced that the Borough has again received the designation of "Tree City USA" and requested a proclamation honoring Arbor Day be read at the next meeting.

Municipal Budget: Mr. Brizzolara said that the governing body is working hard on trying to trim the budget. On the appropriation side the budget is increasing by 2.5%, but almost 14% on what the taxpayers have to pay. This equates to a \$450 tax increase on a home assessed at \$711,000. The Borough is looking at applying for extraordinary aid and deferring pension contributions. The Mayor and Council have chosen to give up their \$250/year stipends as well as the League of Municipalities Conference in November. The governing body is looking at the possibility of furloughs and Mr. Brizzolara invited the public to come forward with suggestions.

Councilwoman Orecchio:

Emergency Medical Services: Mrs. Orecchio informed that Norwood EMS is presently conducting their annual fund drive and contributions are not at the level they were hoping for.

Board of Education: Mrs. Orecchio announced that the School Board Election will be held on Tuesday, April 21 and urged all to go out and vote. There are 3 candidates vying for 2 seats on the Board of Education.

Council President Scott:

Construction Department: Mr. Scott read the Building Department Monthly Report (Attachment "A"). He informed that revenues are down approximately \$35,000.

Board of Health: The Board of Health is working very hard to trim their budget and have employed a part-time individual to replace the retiring full-time person.

Library: The Norwood Public Library has agreed to increase the rent they pay to the Borough by an additional \$25,000.

Councilman Guercio: In the absence of Mr. Guercio no report was given.

Councilman Rapaport:

Police Department: Mr. Rapaport read the Police Department's monthly report. He also informed that the Police Department will receive \$11,017 in Municipal Alliance Grant monies.

Interlocal: Mr. Rapaport reported that the committee is working to wrap up the interlocal agreement to share Building Departments with Northvale and Harrington Park and the projected start date is July 1, 2009. The committee believes that there will be no loss in services to the residents. The plan is to make the Building Department more user friendly and offer more services on-line. Mr. Rapaport commended Mayor Barsa and the Borough Clerk on their efforts. Mr. Rapaport announced that other towns have asked to join the interlocal as well.

Fire Department: In the absence of Mr. Condoleo, Mr. Rapaport read the Fire Departments Monthly Reports for January, February and March (Attachments "B", "C" and "D" respectively).

Finance: In the absence of Mr. Condoleo, Mr. Rapaport invited the public to share their thoughts and suggestions regarding the municipal budget with the Borough Clerk or any member of the Council. Mr. Rapaport informed the Tobar Excavating, the company that has an agreement with the Borough to use our compost facility, has offered to pay the Borough \$4 for every cubic yard of topsoil that they sell. Last year they sold 17,000 cu. yds. of topsoil, that would net the Borough \$50,000.

Fire Department: Mr. Condoleo informed that he had not received the Fire Department's Monthly Report, but thanked the men and women of the Department for all of their efforts.

General Public Comment:

It was moved by Mr. Brizzolara and seconded by Mrs. Orecchio to open the meeting to the public for comment. All Council Members present voted for the motion.

Mr. Stu Bran, 101 Aspen Court said that he is a resident of Northwoods and they have experienced an increase in the odor coming from the compost facility and that the access road is covered with dirt and mud. Mr. Bran reminded that the contractor promised to keep the road clean. Mr. Bran also suggested that the contractor turn the windrows more frequently so as to cut down on the decaying and allow for aeration of the matter. Mayor Barsa said he would speak with the contractor.

Mr. Paul Kapu, Norwood Police Officer said he wished to clarify a remark made recently by Mr. Brizzolara saying that the PBA is refusing to meet with the negotiating committee. Officer Kapu said that was untrue and that the PBA would be willing to sit down with the Mayor and Council to discuss their contract. Officer Kapu stated further that the PBA delayed filing for Arbitration for 3 months in the hope that a contract agreement could be reached. Mayor Barsa said he would schedule a meeting with the PBA.

Lieutenant Richard Sposa addressed the Mayor and Council regarding a disparaging remark that was made about the Police Department by a member of the governing body. The Mayor and Council were in agreement that the comment was inappropriate, but was said during a heated discussion and did not reflect the true feelings of the governing body. Lieutenant Sposa said he felt the individual should publicly apologize to the Police Department.

Lieutenant Sposa informed that he has noticed on numerous occasions that the new batting cage has had the heat on 24/7. He said that if the Borough is looking into ways of saving money they should put locks on the thermostat for the building. Mayor Barsa said that the thermostat presently has a lock and is set at a very low temperature and that Recreation will be helping to pay for the cost of the heat.

Lieutenant Sposa suggested that the Borough look into placing a timer on the lights on Kennedy Field as well as the basketball courts. Mayor Barsa thanked Lieutenant Sposa for his suggestions and that they will be looked into.

Mr. Anthony Foschino, Burlington Street commented on the budget crisis and suggested that it may be time for regionalization of the volunteer organizations. Mr. Foschino questioned the need for the Fire Department and EMS to have so many vehicles, especially the 2 chief SUV's that the Fire Department presently has as well as the expense to outfit a Chief's car for Norwood EMS.



It was moved by Ms. Orecchio and seconded by Mr. Scott to adjourn. All Council Members present voted in favor of the motion and the meeting was adjourned. Meeting adjourned at 9:55 PM.




