

BOROUGH OF NORWOOD
MAYOR AND COUNCIL MINUTES
PUBLIC MEETING, MAY 5, 2009

The Public Meeting of the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Norwood was held at Borough Hall on the above date.

Mayor Barsa called the meeting to order at 8:05 PM and led those in attendance in a salute to the American Flag and asked for a moment of silence.

Mayor Barsa stated:

“Adequate notice of this meeting has been provided in accordance with the Open Public Meeting Law, P.L. 1975, Ch. 231, setting forth the time, date, place and purpose of this Public Meeting through a legal notice published in the Record and Press Journal, filing a copy in the Borough Clerk’s office and posting on the bulletin board.”

Mayor Barsa pointed out the fire exits and requested that all cell phones be turned off or to vibrate.

Mayor Barsa read a letter from Council President Guercio informing that effective May 5, 2009 he was resigning from the Norwood Council. Mayor Barsa presented the letter to the Borough Clerk for recording and informed that there is a vacancy on the Council that requires the Republican County committee to submit 3 names in 15 days to the Council for consideration. The Council has 15 days to choose a replacement. At this time, Mayor Barsa said he would entertain a motion to nominate a new council president. It was moved by Mrs. Orecchio and seconded by Mr. Rapaport to nominate Mr. Scott as Council President. All Council Members present voted for the nomination with Mr. Scott abstaining.

Public Comment on Agenda Items Only:

It was moved by Mr. Rapaport and seconded by Mr. Scott to open the meeting to the public for comment. All Council Members present voted for the motion. There being no member of the public wishing to be heard, a motion to close

the meeting to the public was made by Mr. Scott, seconded by Mr. Rapaport and declared carried upon the affirmative vote of all Council Members present.

Proclamations:

Mayor Barsa read the following proclamations:

Whereas, Municipal Clerks continually strive to improve the administration of the affairs of the Office of the Municipal Clerk through participation in education programs, seminars, workshops and the annual meetings of their state, province, county and international professional organizations, and

Whereas, It is most appropriate that we recognize the accomplishments of the Office of the Municipal Clerk.

Now, Therefore, I, James P. Barsa, Mayor of the Borough of Norwood, do recognize the week of May 3 through May 9, 2009, as Municipal Clerks Week, and further extend appreciation to our Municipal Clerk, Lorraine L. Mayor Barsa read the following correspondence into the record:

3. A letter from Holy Family School informing of the 2009 Carnival to be held from June 16-20
4. A letter from Assemblywoman Charlotte Vandervalk regarding the Borough’s resolution calling for arbitration law reform
5. Press Release from the Borough of Westwood regarding the May 2nd walk to Valley Hospital to protest their attempt to purchase the former Pascack Valley Hospital

Mayor Barsa informed that anyone wishing a copy of the correspondence could request it from the Borough Clerk.

Consent Agenda:

Mayor Barsa reviewed the items on the Consent Agenda and asked if any Council Member wished to remove an item. No Council Member wishing to be heard, Mayor Barsa requested a motion to approve the Consent Agenda consisting of the following items:

09:81 Authorizing the issuance of a peddler’s and solicitor’s license to Ahmad Yasin, 25 Donald Street, Clifton, NJ to sell ice cream

It was moved by Mr. Scott and seconded by Mr. Brizzolara to approve the Consent Agenda. On the roll call vote, all Council Members present voted for the motion.

Introduction of Ordinance 09:03:

Mayor Barsa stated he had before him an ordinance for Council action entitled:

An Ordinance Amending Chapter 168 of the Code of the Borough of Norwood Amending Fees for Use of Athletic Field

It was moved by Mr. Brizzolara and seconded by Mr. Condoleo to table this ordinance for further discussion. On the roll call vote:

Introduction of Ordinance 09:04:

Mayor Barsa stated he had before him an ordinance for Council action entitled:

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND AN ORDINANCE ENTITLED “AN ORDINANCE TO FIX SALARIES, WAGES, AND COMPENSATION OF CERTAIN OFFICIALS, OFFICERS, AND EMPLOYEES OF THE BOROUGH OF NORWOOD, COUNTY OF BERGEN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY” TO PROVIDE FOR AND DETERMINE THE RATE AND METHOD OF COMPENSATION FOR CLASS II SPECIAL LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS EFFECTIVE JANUARY 1, 2009

It was moved by Mr. Scott and seconded by Mr. Rapaport to introduce this ordinance on first reading. On the roll call vote:

Ayes: Brizzolara, Orecchio, Scott, Rapaport and Condoleo
Nays: None

There being five (5) ayes and no nays, Ordinance 09:04 was introduced and the Public Hearing scheduled for Wednesday, June 3, 2009.

Committee Reports:

Councilman Brizzolara:

Utilities: Mr. Brizzolara informed that the Council will be analyzing the water, gas and electric bills for ways to conserve energy.

Municipal Budget: Mr. Brizzolara said that the governing body is looking into a furlough plan to avoid layoffs as well as other areas in the budget to make adjustments to help offset the 14% increase in the amount to be raised by taxation. The Borough is hopeful that they will receive Extraordinary Aid from the State. Councilman Brizzolara said that he was hopeful that the Borough would receive good cooperation from the Departments on energy conservation or the Council may be forced to charge each department's budget for utilities.

Councilwoman Orecchio:

Emergency Medical Services: Mrs. Orecchio referenced an article regarding a bill proposing the removal of State funding for EMT training. She encouraged all to contact their legislators to persuade them to vote against this bill. She informed that Norwood EMS is presently conducting their annual fund drive and contributions are not at the level they were hoping for. Norwood EMS recently held a CPR Certification course that was attended by 50 people.

Board of Education: Mrs. Orecchio announced that the School Board will hold their Reorganization Meeting Monday, May 11, 2009.

Council President Scott:

Construction Department: Mr. Scott read the Building Department Monthly Report (Attachment "A"). He informed that revenues continue to be down.

Haring Cemetery: Mr. Scott informed that quotes have been received for the cobblestone curbing proposed for the Cemetery and Mr. Scott would like to move forward with this project. Mr. Scott said that in order for the curbing to be installed the Borough would need a survey done of the property. It was moved by Mr. Scott and seconded by Mr. Rapaport to authorize the Borough Engineer to submit a quote for the surveying of the Haring Cemetery. All Council Members present voted in favor of the motion.

Councilman Rapaport:

Police Department: Mr. Rapaport read the Police Department's monthly report (Attachment "B").

Livingston Beautification Committee: Mr. Rapaport informed that the plan for the Livingston and Jay Street improvements is presently being revised and when completed will be presented to the County for their review and approval.

Planning Board: There are presently no applications pending before the Planning Board, but the Board has requested that the Mayor and Council review and revise the parking ordinance.

Personnel: The Committee has conducted their first meeting with the Norwood DPW Union and some proposals have been made. Mr. Rapaport requested that the Council convene into closed session following the open portion of this meeting to discuss personnel issues in the Finance Office.

Councilman Condoleo:

Finance Committee: Mr. Condoleo informed that the Committee has an appointment with the State on May 18, 2009 to discuss the budget and the crisis facing the Borough with a 14% increase. Mr. Condoleo said that the Council will continue to look at ways to cut spending and increase revenues.

Fire Department: No report was received prior to the meeting. Mr. Condoleo thanked the members of the Fire Department for their dedication and volunteerism.

Historic Preservation Committee: On May 7, 2009 the Norwood Historic Preservation Society will be recognized by the County and receive a Commendation for the work they've did on the Haring Cemetery.

Mayor Barsa:

DPW: Mayor Barsa reported that the DPW continues to make general repairs and up keep on borough buildings and fields. It was requested that Mayor Barsa speak with Mr. DiRese regarding the use of Bio-diesel for borough trucks.

Compost Facility: Mayor Barsa informed that he has worked out an agreement with Tobar Construction to amend the present contract for the Compost Facility to have Tobar pay the Borough \$4/cu.yd. of topsoil that is sold. This will be paid monthly to the Borough

General Public Comment:

It was moved by Mr. Condoleo and seconded by Mr. Brizzolara to open the meeting to the public for comment. All Council Members present voted for the motion.

There being no member of the public wishing to be heard, a motion to close the meeting to the public was made by Mr. Brizzolara, seconded by Mrs. Orecchio and declared carried upon the affirmative vote of all Council Members present.



It was moved by Mr. Brizzolara, seconded by Mr. Rapaport to accept the resignation as Tax Collector from Ms. Maureen Neville effective June 30, 2009 and appoint Mr. Kunjesh Trivedi, Tax Collector effective July 1, 2009. Mr. Trivedi will receive an additional salary of \$10,000 for the position. All Council Members present voted for the motion.

Adjournment:

It was moved by Mr. Condoleo and seconded by Mr. Scott to adjourn. All Council Members present voted in favor of the motion and the meeting was adjourned. Meeting adjourned at 9:00 PM.

Today's dismal economic conditions warrants difficult financial decisions on the state level, but volunteer emergency medical technicians (EMTs) fear that Gov. Corzine's plan to cut the EMT Training Fund will ultimately render defunct volunteer emergency service groups.

Corzine's plan. "As it is the fund already operates on a deficit and if Corzine gets his way and takes money from it, it will essentially be bankrupt," Firenze said. "It's sad because when Corzine was involved in a motor vehicle accident a few years back, EMT volunteers were the first ones to respond and they played a large role in his medical care. This is such a weird way for him to say 'thank you.'"

"I'm in my 13th year of service now and it's a big commitment to be a volunteer because a lot of your time, time away from family and friends, is involved," Firenze said. "To ask volunteers to not only give their time but to pay out of pocket for training as well, is asking too much. Training is expensive and recertification is required every three years, so it's very costly."

Mateus strongly believes that a fervent approach opposing Corzine's plan is necessary because to him, this plan will have a catastrophic effect on communities as a whole.

Since hearing of Corzine's plans, the NJEMSEA has orchestrated a campaign aimed at encouraging emergency service groups to reach out to their elected officials as well as the governor's office and express their discontent with the governor's proposal.

"This is not just an EMT issue, it's a public safety issue," Mateus said in a released statement. "If volunteers are unable to maintain their educational training, the state will lose a vital part of the pre-hospital care system in the state. If residents enjoy knowing their volunteer squad will respond when they dial 911, they need to act now to protect themselves and the volunteer system."

Firenze says that the Northvale volunteer corps has already started an e-mail campaign to state legislators in which they've stated their position on the issue and requested support in opposing

if Corzine cuts \$4 million from the fund, only \$400,000 will be left as of July 1 and that will meet anticipated expenses for next year," Mateus told Northern Valley Press. "This means that volunteers will have to start paying for training themselves and likely if they can't afford to do so municipalities might have to pay employees to replace the volunteers. This will cost local government a lot of money in the long run."







Summons Productivity 5 Year Comparison






Incident Frequency by TYPE (Top 40 of 93 Shown) (Using DATE RECD)



By Day of Week




Weekday vs Weekend










Weekday vs Weekend




Incident Frequency by Month (Using DATE RECD)
