The Public Meeting of the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Norwood was held at Borough Hall on the above date.

Mayor Barsa called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM and led those in attendance in a salute to the American Flag and asked for a moment of silence in remembrance.

General Public Comment:

Motion to open the meeting to the public was made by Mr. Brizzolara, seconded by Mr. Scott and declared carried upon the affirmative vote of all Council Members present.

No member of the public wishing to be heard, a motion to close the meeting to the public was made by Mr. Brizzolara and seconded by Mrs. Orecchio. All Council Members present voted in favor of the motion.

Motion of approval was made by Mr. Brizzolara, seconded by Mr. Scott and declared carried upon the affirmative vote of all Council Members present.

Introduction of Ordinance 14:13 entitled:

An Ordinance Amending Chapter 168 of the Code of the Borough of Norwood
Regulating Parks and Recreation Areas to Prohibit Smoking

Upon being told that no response has yet been received from the Meadowlands Conservation Trust or the Norwood Swim Club Board of Trustees regarding whether they would have objection to this ordinance since it would pertain to the Central Woods and Swim Club property, Mr. Scott voiced his opinion that it be limited to Kennedy Field and Trackside Park. There was discussion that the ordinance could be introduced this evening and, if necessary, amended at the Public Hearing. Therefore, motion to introduce ordinance 14:13 was made by Mr. Marino and seconded by Mrs. Orecchio. All Council Members present voted in favor of the motion with the exception of Mr. Scott who voted no.

Mr. Scott reminded that some Board of Education property would also be effected by this ordinance and it was decided that the Borough Clerk's office send them a letter similar to the one sent to the Meadowlands Conservation Trust and the Swim Club's Board of Trustees. Mayor Barsa announced that the Public Hearing on this Ordinance would be November 12, 2014.

Committee Reports:

Councilman Brizzolara

Fire Department:

Mr. Brizzolara noted that he was in receipt of the September Fire Department monthly report (Attachment "A").

Personnel:

Mr. Brizzolara advised that he had nothing to report.

Councilman Marino

Environmental Commission:

Mr. Marino referred to a letter received from the Hackensack River Keeper endorsing the adoption of a resolution supporting sustainable state funding for the preservation and stewardship of open space, parks, farmland and historic sites in New Jersey. He advised that he spoke with the Environmental Commission Chair, Christine Hageman who recommended that the Council adopt such a resolution that is in keeping with the County and Municipal penny tax.

Cultural Affairs Committee:

Mr. Marino announced that the Home for the Holiday Parade is scheduled for December 14, 2014. Participants to date include the Norwood Fire Department, the Fire Departments of neighboring towns, local school bands and choirs. The parade route will run from Norwood Public School on Summit Street to Hudson Avenue to Livingston Street to Broadway and conclude at the Fire House where there will be a visit with Santa and music and refreshments. Food establishments on Livingston Street will be asked to participate by offering a holiday special promotion of their choice. Chief Krapels is attempting to get the Sheriff's Department bagpipes to join the parade. Valley Transportation on Jay Street has offered to donate two buses and drivers to transport spectators from Kennedy Field to the parade area on Livingston Street. Mr. Marino concluded that this event may be the impetus for the formation of a Chamber of Commerce.

Board of Health:

Mr. Marino advised that Mrs. Tuite has tendered her resignation from the Board of Health. Due to the number of recent public health concerns, it is the Board's desire to recruit physicians from the community to serve. (The September Board of Health report was distributed to the Mayor and Council – Attachment "B")

At this time, Mr. Brizzolara moved that a resolution endorsing the establishment of a long-term, dedicated source of state funding for the preservation of open space, parks, farmland and historic sites be placed on the October 29, 2014 Work Session Agenda. The motion was seconded by Mr. Marino and declared carried upon the affirmative vote of all Council Members present.

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Councilwoman Orecchio

Mrs. Orecchio commended Mr. Marino and the members of his committee for the hard work and effort they are putting into the Home for the Holiday Parade.

EMS:

Mrs. Orecchio reported being in receipt of the September EMS report (Attachment "C").

Board of Education:

Mrs. Orecchio referred to a letter received from the Norwood Public School commending Chief Krapels, Capt. Buongiorno, Sgt. Russino and Detective Amatucci for their response during two recent potentially dangerous incidents at the school involving students. She continued that the local public school teachers are still without a contract.

Council President Scott

Construction Office:

Council President Scott advised he is in receipt of the Permit Fee Log Report for the month of September (Attachment "D").

Library:

Mr. Scott had nothing to report.

Seniors:

Mr. Scott referred to Resolution 14:186 that was approved on the Consent Agenda noting the Borough will be receiving \$2,500 from the County for senior activities.

Councilman Rapaport

In the absence of Mr. Rapaport, no report was given. (Chief Krapels' September Police Department report was distributed to the Mayor and Council – Attachment "E".)

Councilman Ascolese

DPW:

Mr. Ascolese referred to the DPW monthly report (Attachment "F"). He reported that the new back hoe with all attachments has arrived. Mr. Ascolese continued that the DPW Super has asked that an individual be hired temporarily during leaf season since an employee is out with an injury. He will ask the DPW Super to provide exact numbers as to the time span and hours needed.

At this time, Mr. Ascolese questioned the Borough Engineer whether the LOI has been submitted to the DEP regarding the DPW garage replacement. Mr. Kaufman advised that it was submitted last week and that time has to be given for them to receive and review it.

Mayor Barsa reported that there is sufficient money in the Livingston Street Streetscape Phase II project to extend it another 400 ft. north on Livingston Street.

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At this time, Mayor Barsa asked for a motion to open the meeting to the public. Motion was made by Mrs. Orecchio, seconded by Mr. Scott and declared carried upon the affirmative vote of all Council Members present.

Paul Haberman, 41 Tappan Road, advised that his law firm used two physician experts and would be happy to contact them with more information about serving on the Board of Health. Mr. Marino and Mr. Haberman will further discuss this matter.

Peter McDermott, 74 Kensington Avenue, questioned the possibility of having Wilton Court paved. He explained that when there is a rainstorm, the runoff from the three driveways that go into the roadway cause it to become a sheet of ice and the road is never plowed properly. Mayor Barsa asked the Borough Engineer to review the area and determine what options are available for report at the next meeting.

At 7:45 PM, motion to approve Resolution 14:190 authorizing the Council to proceed in Closed Session to discuss settlement of a tax appeal and a matter relating to the purchase, lease or acquisition of real property was made by Mrs. Orecchio and seconded by Mr. Scott. All Councilmembers present voted in favor of the motion.


Mayor Barsa resumed the meeting at 8:06 PM.

Old Business:


- Monthly "Do You Know" Articles continue to be provided and published in the Suburbanite.




Summons Productivity 5 Year Comparison







Weekday vs Weekend









School

A municipality is not a pesticide business and cannot apply pesticides on property other than what they are responsible for. School property is different than municipal property. There are different boards in charge. So shared services for pesticide applications, as I read and interpret the laws, is not legal in this situation. Pesticide organizations can only apply to their own property unless they are a business for hire. Municipalities, Schools, Apartment complexes, Cemeteries, may apply pesticides but only for themselves. They are not for hire and therefore not pesticide businesses. They must have licensed personnel to apply pesticides but no business license is required.

E waste pick-up was made easy with our new J Hook truck. We were able to drop a container off at the Buckingham nursing home for them to load over 200 TV sets and to return the following day to pick it up for efficient recycling this month.

An unsafe wooden guard rail at the pond was removed and was replaced with a steel guard rail that was recycled from the rear of the Livingston St. stores on Jay St.

We are currently replacing worn out parts for the leaf collection equipment. All of these parts were lost in the fire and had to be ordered this summer. Much of our time is being spent rebuilding these four machines including the retrofitting and maintenance of the trucks that are towing them in preparation of the fall season.

Including all the small work we do that I may or may not have mentioned, truck washing, traffic sign installations, traffic signal bulb changes, tree removals, pot hole repairs and much more that must be done and cannot be neglected.

As superintendent, I am seeing many job tasks not being performed due to inadequate man power in our department that is very important to our community.

The first is sewer maintenance, this year it's been only possible to keep up with the trouble areas. Whereas, our sanitary sewer system is ageing and needs more frequent servicing. Secondly is our storm water management. Our storm water system is over 100 years old. Maintaining storm basin cleaning has been minimal, rebuilding storm basins has become more frequent. Hydraulically cleaning storm water pipes has not been done in decades unless it's not working at all. This task is a very time consuming operation, but needs and should be done. And finally road maintenance, more road maintenance must also be considered, just fixing pot holes is not enough. We need to start a crack seal program to protect our roadways before it's too late and cost thousands in paving. I hope in the year 2015 the governing body can help me out with these important issues.

There is so much room for improvements in our community, and with the proper work force I can accomplish them.

I will soon thank everyone involved who helped in rebuilding our department. We are now back on our feet again. The new back hoe has arrived with all its attachments. This piece of equipment is the back bone of our dept. All of our trucks are near completion with plows, sanders, lights, radios, and graphics. Moral is up greatly – We now have what it takes to get the job done safely, efficiently, and we look good.
