PUBLIC MEETING
SEPTEMBER 9, 2015**

The Public Meeting of the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Norwood was held at Borough Hall on the above date.

Mayor Barsa called the meeting to order at 7:04 PM and led those in attendance in a salute to the American Flag and asked for a moment of silence.

Mayor Barsa stated:

“Adequate notice of this meeting has been provided in accordance with the Open Public Meeting Law, P.L. 1975, Ch. 231, setting forth the time, date, place and purpose of this Public Meeting through a legal notice published in the Record and Star Ledger, filing a copy in the Borough Clerk’s office and posting on the bulletin board.”

Mayor Barsa pointed out the fire exits and requested that all cell phones be turned off or to vibrate.

General Public Comment:

It was moved by Mr. Brizzolara and seconded by Mrs. Orecchio to open the meeting to the public for comment. All Council Members present voted for the motion.

Mr. Dominick Congiusti, President Norwood Fire Company No. 1 informed that the Fire Department would once again be participating in Norwood Day. They will be serving hotdogs with sauerkraut and onions. They also will have four kegs of root beer to distribute to the participants. Mr. Congiusti went on to discuss the dispute between the Fire Department and the Zoning Board of Adjustment. After Mr. Congiusti’s lengthy dissertation where he insinuated that members of the Zoning Board have not completed the mandatory training and have personal conflicts, Mayor Barsa responded that during the meeting with the governing body and the Zoning Board, the Fire Department’s complaint of mistreatment was not discussed. Mayor Barsa also requested that Mr. Congiusti discuss his concerns with the Zoning Board.

General Public Comment Continued:

Mr. Anthony Foschino, 287 Summit Street a member of the Zoning Board informed that the Board takes all comments and recommendations from the Police, Fire and EMS seriously, but sometimes their hands are tied by the zoning ordinance and if the applicant is not seeking relief from a certain section of the Code, the Board cannot ask them for additional relief. It was suggested that the Zoning and Planning Boards conduct a round table discussion of the zoning ordinances and look for areas that may need revisions.

Mayor Barsa

Mayor Barsa informed that he has spoken to Cross Country Cowboy regarding the baseball backstop netting at the Knickerbocker Baseball Field and the construction will be completed and the area will be restored prior to Norwood Day.

Mayor Barsa also informed that the Micro paving of Summit Street began last Friday and he received numerous calls regarding the quality of the paving. He inspected the street and spoke with the contractor and Borough Engineer regarding the quality of the work. He then spoke with a representative from the Borough of Tenafly who invited him to come to Tenafly to inspect the roads that were done there over the past year. Upon inspection, Mayor Barsa informed that he was fully satisfied with the quality of the work, but informed the contractor that he could not do Summit Street in front of the school until September 14th and 15th

Mayor Barsa announced that Norwood Day will be Saturday, September 19, 2015 beginning at 2:00 PM. He invited all to attend the fun filled day which will feature music by The Southern Rock Superstars, rides, games, displays by local organizations and food from local restaurants and vendors.

Mr. Brizzolara also commented on the micro paving saying that he was pleased with the job they did on High Street.

Fire Department:

The Department has begun forming a committee for the purchase of a new truck. Closed Session:



WHEREAS, 46 children in the United States will be diagnosed with cancer each day; and

WHEREAS, 1 out of 5 children diagnosed with cancer will not survive the disease; and

WHEREAS, the types of cancers that affect children are most often very different from those that affect adults as childhood cancer is not just one disease but is made up of a dozen types and countless subtypes of cancer; and

WHEREAS, childhood cancer, the leading cause of death by disease in US children under 19 years of age, spares no socioeconomic, ethnic, racial or geographic class and its causes are largely unknown and not linked to lifestyle as with adult cancers; and


WHEREAS, two-thirds of childhood cancer patients will develop long-lasting chronic conditions as a result from treatment that prevent them from fully participating in school and social activities; and

WHEREAS, childhood cancer rates have been rising for the past few decades and approximately 15,780 children were diagnosed in 2014, and the incidence of invasive pediatric cancer is up to 29% in the past 20 years; and

WHEREAS, childhood cancer kills more children than AIDS, asthma, cystic fibrosis, diabetes and muscular dystrophy combined with less than 5 percent of the federal government's total funding for cancer research being dedicated to childhood cancers.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, James P. Bara, Mayor of the Borough of Norwood do hereby proclaim September 2015 as **CHILDHOOD CANCER AWARENESS MONTH** in the Borough of Norwood to help raise awareness of pediatric cancer and its victims.

August Monthly Report

Summer's end is near.

The Norwood DPW has made sure that the Norwood Public School is ready for its reopening this year. All Norwood crosswalks, stop bars, and yellow No Parking curbs have been painted and lawn maintenance has been completed.

All football and soccer fields were marked out and painted. This will continue each week until the season games are finished.

Maintenance on our leaf machines has begun. Adding a Tink Claw attachment to our John Deere backhoe will greatly improve leaf removal collections. This attachment was purchased through recycling tonnage grant and will arrive mid-October

Many trees throughout Norwood have died from lack of water this summer. We anticipate that the "dead trees" list will grow and we will budget accordingly next year for tree removal.

Chipping roadside brush continues on a bi-weekly schedule during the summer and will be halted during leaf season pickup.

Our new blacktop roller has arrived and will be put to use next week.

We will also be purchasing a hotbox trailer with Old Tappan. This item was on the capital list.

And is another shared service purchase.

Street sweeping- storm water management continues. As does garbage and litter pickup.
Weekly grass cutting, edging, and weeding continue.

The Boy Scout outdoor seating project at the Norwood Library is nearing completion.

The men of the Norwood DPW have been trying to keep up with the extra maintenance of the new water fountain installed at the Gulf station as well the monument water fountain. The summer sun has not been cooperating with us and we are constantly filling up both water fountains.

We have also been trying to get back on track with our sewer and catch basin maintenance. We are making headway, but there is still much work to be done. We were able to attend a JIF safety course on sewer jet safety in Northvale.

John Oddo and I have completed the license requirements for our C1 and C2 wastewater licenses. We attended courses down in Rutgers University and it was a nice refresher.

I also prepared the men for leaf season with a JIF leaf vac safety course in Northvale.

The maintenance of the building continues.

CDL drug testing was also performed this month.

All first of the month inspections and documentations were completed this month.

E-waste pickup was completed

Senior pickup and drop offs have been completed.

The 2015 Recycling Tonnage report was completed.






Summons Productivity 5 Year Comparison

Accidents 5 Year Comparison





Incident Frequency by TYPE (Top 40 of 160 Shown) (Using DATE RECD)










Incident Frequency by TYPE (Top 40 of 81 Shown) (Using DATE RECD)
