The Public Meeting of the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Norwood was held at Borough Hall on the above date.

Mayor Barsa called the meeting to order at 7:05 PM and led those in attendance in a salute to the American Flag and asked for a moment of silence.

Mayor Barsa stated:

Oath of Office:

Mayor Barsa issued the oath of office to newly appointed Sergeant Thomas Tobin. All in attendance gave a round of applause congratulating all of the officers.

Veterans Day Proclamation

Whereas, the 11th of November 1918, marked the end of the 'war to end all wars' and the cessation of the most destructive, sanguinary, and far reaching war in human annals and the resumption by the people of the United States of peaceful relations with other nations, which we hope may never again be severed, and

Whereas, it is fitting that the recurring anniversary of this date should be commemorated with thanksgiving and prayer and exercises designed to perpetuate peace through good will and mutual understanding between nations; and

Whereas, on June 1, 1954 Congress declared that Armistice Day should be Veterans Day to honor all who had served in all wars to preserve world peace and on October 8, 1954 President Dwight D. Eisenhower issued the first Veterans Day Proclamation, and

Whereas, to protect the Nation they love, our veterans stepped forward when America needed them most. In conflicts around the world, their sacrifice and resolve helped destroy the enemies of freedom and saved millions from oppression. In answering history's call with honor, decency, and resolve, our veterans have shown the power of liberty and earned the respect and admiration of a grateful Nation, and

Whereas, all of America's veterans have placed our Nation's security before their own lives, creating a debt that we can never fully repay. Our veterans represent the best of America, and they deserve the best America can give them,

Therefore, I, James P. Barsa, Mayor of the Borough of Norwood, do hereby proclaim November 11, 2015, as Veterans Day and urge all citizens of Norwood to recognize the valor and sacrifice of our veterans through ceremonies and prayers.

Personnel:

Mr. Brizzolara informed that the committee is presently interviewing for the position of deputy borough clerk.

Councilman Marino

Holiday Parade:

Mr. Marino informed that the Home for the Holidays Parade will kick off at 5:00 PM on Saturday, December 5, 2015 and thanked the DPW for putting up the banner on Broadway.

Environmental Commission:

The Commission is presently working on a shade tree ordinance.

Board of Health:

Mr. Marino said that beginning January 1, 2016 all restaurants that receive a conditional or lower rating from the health officer will be published in the Record.

EMS:

Mrs. Orecchio reported being in receipt of the monthly report for September, see Attachment "A".

Board of Education:

Mrs. Orecchio announced that the high school will have four new board members in January and the Board is presently finishing the Referendum that they would like to present to the voters next year.

Department of Public Works:

Mr. Ascolese submitted the Road Department's monthly report for the record, Attachment "B". He announced that leaf collection has begun and that landscapers are permitted to place grass and leaves at the curb.

Councilman Rapaport:

Police Department:

Mr. Rapaport referenced the Police Department's Monthly Report, Attachment "C". Mr. Rapaport commended Sgt. Henrici on his service to the Borough of Norwood and said that Sgt. Tobin was viewed in high esteem by his fellow officers.

Planning Board:

Mr. Rapaport informed that many classes are being offered at the League of Municipalities Convention for planning and zoning as well as a JIF class for elected officials that will reduce the Borough's premium by \$250/official for attending.

Councilman Scott:

Mr. Scott had nothing to report at this time.

Mayor Barsa:

Recreation:

Mayor Barsa informed that at the last Recreation Committee meeting the topic of tennis courts was discussed. It was the consensus of the Committee to not move forward with the grant for the tennis courts. The Committee recommended that the Borough reconstruct the football field to alleviate the sink holes. Mayor Barsa also stated that the Borough of Harrington Park has expressed an interest in sharing the cost of the reconstruction. After some discussion on the application submitted to Bergen County Open Space Trust Fund for tennis courts it was the consensus of the governing body to withdraw the application and return the grant money for the shuffleboard courts. The proposed cost for the new field is in the area of \$300,000. The governing body will look into this during the budget process for next year.

In the month of October Norwood EMS personnel logged 2420 hours on calls and 32 hours on drills/monthly meeting.

October Monthly Report 2015

Its fall once again, leaf collections are in full swing. Leaf season officially begins November second suspending brush pick up during this season.

All first of the month's inspections and documentations have been completed.

All water meters are scheduled for removal after sports play offs have ended. At that time outdoor restrooms will be winterized and closed for the season. All irrigation systems have also been winterized.

On the end of Jay St. two jersey barriers were placed closing off the cul-de-sac and the parking area was posted with 2hr. signage that Mr. and Mrs. Park requested at the council meeting.

Extra maintenance was performed at the public library. Squirrels got into the heat and AC duct insulation, and boy what a mess they made. All was repaired and cleaned up.

With new pallet shelving, and alarm system in place our public works garage project is finished. This will certainly help with efficiency and protecting our assets.

We are prepared for *winter*. All sanders are mounted to the trucks, salt sheds are full, plows are ready and all vehicles have been serviced. Hope the *winter* goes as fast as summer did!

The heat exchangers were replaced at town hall. The new heaters are in the process of being installed at the old DPW. All public building heat and AC units have been serviced.

New fall banners were put up on Livingston St. and its fountain will also be winterized as soon as the weather gets cold.

All E waste has been collected and removed from the DPW yard.

All accumulated road sweepings from 2015 have been properly disposed of as per DEP regulations.

Senior van shopping, doctor appointment pick up and drop offs continue.

The 5k run went well; all posters and banner were removed.

We had a safety inspection at the public works new garage and left you a copy of the report.






Summons Productivity 5 Year Comparison







Weekday vs Weekend








