

**MINUTES
MAYOR AND COUNCIL
BOROUGH OF NORWOOD
PUBLIC MEETING
August 7, 2007**

The Public Meeting of the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Norwood was held at Borough Hall on the above date.

Mayor Barsa called the meeting to order at 8:05 PM.

Mayor Barsa led the Council and those in attendance in a salute to the American flag and asked for a moment of silence.

Mayor Barsa stated:

“ Adequate notice of this meeting has been provided in accordance with the Open Public Meeting Law, P.L. 1975, Ch. 231, setting forth the time, date, place and purpose of this Public Meeting through a legal notice published in the Press Journal on January 11, 2007, filing a copy in the Borough Clerk’s office and posting on the bulletin board.”

Mayor Barsa pointed out the fire exits.

Mayor Barsa welcomed everyone to the public meeting and thanked Emergency Management for notifying residents regarding the “Boil Water Advisory”. Mayor Barsa asked residents with unpublished or Cablevision phone numbers to contact Chief Krapels to have their numbers added to the list for notification.

Presentations:

Mayor Barsa presented Certificates of Appreciation to the many volunteers who contributed to the 2007 Northeast Bergen All-Star Tournament’s success.

Public Comment:

It was moved by Mr. Guercio and seconded by Mr. Brizzolara to open the meeting to the public for comment. All Council Members present voted for the motion.

Public Comment Continued:

Mr. and Mrs. McMahon, 6 Burlington Street requested Mayor and Council assistance regarding excessive noise coming from Pine Brook Kennel. The McMahon's handed the Mayor and Council numerous incident reports, letters and a petition (See Attachments A-G) along with playing a recording of the dogs barking and informed that they filed a complaint with Norwood Municipal Court and are awaiting a court date. Mr. Fede, Borough Counsel advised that this issue lies with the Municipal Court since complaints have been filed, but that the Mayor and Council could take a look at the noise ordinance to see if they wanted to modify it.

Mr. Chubby Bocchino, Livingston Street asked if the intent of the Mayor and Council was to create an island down the middle of Livingston Street as part of the beautification plan. Mayor Barsa explained that this is one plan proposed by Bergen County during the review process regarding the Borough's request to narrow the roadway.

Mr. Alex Rittenberg, 176 Millbrook Circle brought the Mayor and Council up-to-date on his progress with Fox Hill Woods as part of an Eagle Scout Project. The trails are complete and Mr. Rittenberg was seeking Council approval regarding signs to be posted. He handed out (Attachment "H") a sample of a sign. The Council approved the sign along with two smaller signs regarding "No ATV's" and asked Mr. Rittenberg to contact the DPW regarding the ordering and installation of the signs.

Ms. Marlene Westhelle, 17 Clinton Street said she was here this evening seeking Mayor and Council assistance regarding a patio that she has constructed in her back yard. Mrs. Westhelle explained that she had an existing paver patio that she wanted to remove and expand. This project included the installation of gas, water and electric. When Mrs. Westhelle went to the building department seeking the various permits needed, she was told by the Construction Official that he could not approve the plans without additional information. Mrs. Westhelle introduced her brother, Mr. Kenneth DeGennaro, P.E., Brooker Engineering, 76 Lafayette Avenue, Suffern, New York. He explained that Mr. Renaud informed Mrs. Westhelle that she would have to make application for a variance to construct the patio. Mr. DeGennaro reviewed the zoning requirements regarding setbacks and explained why he felt the patio did not fall within these requirements. Mrs. Westhelle informed that the patio construction has been completed. Mr. Fede, Borough Counsel advised that it was not within the purview of the Mayor and Council to grant relief from the decision of the Zoning Officer. Mr. Fede went on to explain that was the job of the Board of Adjustment to review and interpret the decision of the zoning ordinances. Mayor Barsa said he would reach out to Mr. Renaud, Construction Official to find out when he would be issuing his letter of denial regarding the patio.

No other member of the public wishing to be heard, a motion to close the meeting to the public was made by Mrs. Senatore, seconded by Mr. Brizzolara and declared carried upon the affirmative vote of all Council Members present.

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Proclamation : *You Drink and Drive, You lose Over the Limit Under Arrest 2007 Impaired Driving Crackdown*

WHEREAS, impaired drivers on our nation's roads kill someone every 30 minutes, 50 people per day and almost 18,000 people each year; and

WHEREAS, 34% of motor vehicle fatalities in New Jersey are alcohol-related; and

WHEREAS, a statewide enforcement crackdown is planned to combat impaired driving; and

WHEREAS, the summer season is traditionally a time of social gatherings which often include alcohol; and

WHEREAS, the State of New Jersey, Division of Highway Traffic Safety, has asked law enforcement agencies throughout New Jersey to participate in the *Over the Limit Under Arrest 2007 Impaired Driving Crackdown*; and

WHEREAS, the project will involve increase impaired driving enforcement from August 17-September 3, 2007; and

WHEREAS, an increase in impaired driving enforcement and a reduction in impaired driving will save lives on our roadway.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, be it resolved that the Borough of Norwood declares it's support for the *You Drink and Drive, You lose Over the Limit Under Arrest 2007 Impaired Driving Crackdown* from August 17 – September 3, 2007 and pledges to increase awareness of the dangers of drinking and driving.

It was moved by Mr. Condoleo and seconded by Mrs. Senatore to approve the Consent Agenda. On the roll call vote, all Council Members present voted for the motion.

Continuation of Public Hearing on Ordinance 07:26:

Mayor Barsa explained that this ordinance was carried from the July 3, 2007 Public Meeting and is awaiting further action from the Council. The ordinance is entitled:

VACATING A PORTION OF BLANCH AVENUE IN THE BOROUGH OF NORWOOD

Mr. Brizzolara offered a motion to open the meeting to the public. The motion was seconded by Mrs. Senatore with all Council Members present voting in favor of the motion. No one wishing to be heard, it was moved by Mr. Guercio and seconded by Mr. Brizzolara to close the meeting to the public. All Council Members present voted in

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favor of the motion. No Council action was taken on this ordinance. A discussion ensued regarding the comments given at the last meeting from residents of Closter regarding this ordinance. The Council agreed to consider the recommendations and have Mr. Fede, Borough Attorney draft a new ordinance vacating a portion of Blanch Avenue to a width of eight feet.

Public Hearing of Ordinance 07:29:

Mayor Barsa stated that he had before him Ordinance 07:29 for Council action entitled:

**AUTHORIZING THE BOROUGH TO GRANT TO THE
MEADOWLANDS CONSERVATION TRUST A CONSERVATION
EASEMENT FOR THE PROPERTY IN THE AREA KNOWN AS
FOX HILL IN THE BOROUGH OF NORWOOD**

Mr. Brizzolara offered a motion to open the meeting to the public. The motion was seconded by Mr. Guercio with all Council Members present voting in favor of the motion.

Ms. Christine Hageman, 17 Garnett Place informed that the Environmental Commission endorses the adoption of this ordinance along with the conservation easement. Ms. Hageman explained that Hillside Meadow was the only meadow in town and that Mr. Rittenberg is completing his Eagle Scout Project in this area.

Mr. Greg Salerno, 401 D'Ercole Court questioned why the Borough was preserving only the west side of Fox Hill and not the entire area. Mayor Barsa explained that the west side is comprised of wetlands and non-developable. Mr. Salerno wanted to know if the town was planning on developing the east side. Mayor Barsa said the Borough was proceeding in stages and he was uncertain what if any plans were for the east side. Councilman Brizzolara asked how many acres were not covered by the conservation easement. Mayor Barsa informed that 50 acres are being preserved and that the east side of Fox Hill contains approximately another 50 acres.

No other member of the public wishing to be heard, it was moved by Mr. Brizzolara and seconded by Mrs. Senatore to close the meeting to the public. All Council Members present voted in favor of the motion.

A motion to adopt Ordinance 07:29 was made by Mr. Brizzolara and seconded by Mrs. Senatore with all Council Members present voting in favor of the motion. Mayor Barsa announced that the ordinance was finally adopted and will take effect upon publication in the Press Journal.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Councilman Brizzolara:

Beautification Committee:

Mr. Brizzolara referenced a letter received from Mr. Procida offering his services on the Livingston Street Beautification Committee and wanted to know if the Mayor had reached out to him. Mayor Barsa informed that he has not contacted Mr. Procida as yet,

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but he intends to invite him to the next meeting. No date has been set for the meeting but it should be sometime in September.

Hudson and Tappan Flooding Problem:

Mr. Brizzolara requested that Mr. Matt Neuls, Neglia Engineering update the Council on the status of this problem. Mr. Neuls informed that a meeting was held with the engineer and developer for the project to review the revised plans regarding curbs and a drainage filtration system. The plans are to be submitted to Bergen County for their approval. Mr. Condoleo asked if the sale of the homes was being held up. Mr. Neuls responded that there were six items to be addressed prior to a certificate of occupancy being issued. Mr. Condoleo questioned whether a C.O. could be held up pending the construction of curbs. Mr. Neuls explained that the curbing is a requirement of Bergen County and the contractor had to post a bond with the County to ensure its construction.

Councilman Knigin:

In Mr. Knigin's absence, no report was given

Council President Scott:

In Mr. Scott's absence, no report was given.

Councilman Guercio:

Mr. Guercio had nothing to report at this time.

Councilwoman Senatore:

Mrs. Senatore informed that the Swift Reach System has been an asset to the Borough.

Councilman Condoleo:

Recreation:

Mr. Condoleo thanked the Recreation volunteers for the outstanding job they did during the Northeast Bergen All-Star Tournament.

Fire Department:

Mr. Condoleo read the Fire Department monthly report for June (Attachment "I").

Finance:

Mr. Condoleo reported that 99% of all checks are being scanned into the computer using the new check scanning equipment. Mr. Condoleo referenced the Corrective Action Plan submitted by the CFO for the Audit year ending 12/31/2006, Finding #5 regarding the affordable housing fees charged to developers and informed that the CFO will be writing a letter to the Borough Attorney to address the fee ordinance and possible revisions.

Items for discussion:

Joan Mullane, Registrar and Board of Health Secretary addressed the Mayor and Council regarding her current salary and the Board of Health's recommendation for an increase. Mrs. Mullane supplied the Mayor and Council with a packet and cover letter from her dated August 1, 2007, and a letter dated December 1, 2006 from Mr. Joseph A. Komosinski, State Registrar regarding the role of the local registrar, Borough of Norwood Self Assessment, Salary History and 2006 Salary Ordinance (Attachment "J"). Mrs. Mullane defined the role of the Registrar and explained how the position has grown in recent years and the increase to the work load. Mrs. Mullane also explained her other duties as Secretary to the Board of Health. Mrs. Mullane informed that the Board of Health has recommended a salary adjustment for the past two years and the Mayor and Council has denied the raise. Mayor Barsa asked Mrs. Mullane to explain her duties and how the position has changed over the past few years. Mrs. Mullane informed that she is required to be certified by the State of New Jersey and that laws have changed regarding identification requiring more people to seek certified copies of their birth or marriage licenses. Mrs. Mullane reviewed the other duties that are entailed in running the Health Department. Mrs. Mullane said that she feels she is not being adequately compensated for the work she is doing. Mrs. Gloria Ellenio, member of the Board of Health and former registrar of the Borough of Ridgefield Park spoke in support of Mrs. Mullane and offered her opinion that she is deserving of a salary adjustment.

2006 Annual Audit – Approval of Resolution 07:136 and signing of Group Affidavit:

It was moved by Mr. Guercio and seconded by Mrs. Senatore to approve Resolution 07:136 with all Council Members present voting in favor of the motion. The Group Affidavit was circulated for council signature.

DOT Trust Fund Grant Applications for 2008:

After some discussion the following applications were approved for filing with the New Jersey Department of Transportation:

1. McClellan Street Sidewalks
2. Summit Street and High Street Raised Intersections
3. Broadway Sidewalks

It was moved by Mr. Guercio and seconded by Mr. Brizzolara to approve Resolution 07:137 authorizing the submission of the above applications to NJ DOT for 2008, with all council members present voting in favor of the motion,

Additional Traffic Engineering Services – Livingston Street Beautification:

Mr. Matt Neuls, Neglia Engineering explained the need for additional traffic study which was the result of a meeting between the Borough and Bergen County Planning Board regarding the narrowing of Livingston Street. The County is requiring the additional study to determine if parallel parking is feasible. It was moved by Mrs. Senatore and seconded by Mr. Brizzolara to approve Resolution 07:138 authorizing Neglia Engineering to perform additional traffic studies at a cost not to exceed \$18,500.00 with all Council Members present voting in favor of the motion.

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Request from Environment New Jersey to canvass in the Borough:

Following a discussion, the consensus of the Council was to approve the request.

New FAA Rules:

Mayor Barsa referenced a recent article in the Record regarding new FAA Rules that would change flight patterns and direct more air traffic over the Pascack Valley. Mayor Barsa said he felt that the Borough of Norwood should join with the surrounding municipalities to protest the new regulations. The Council was in agreement with Mayor Barsa.

General Public Comment:

It was moved by Mr. Brizzolara and seconded by Mrs. Senatore to open the meeting to the public for comment. All Council Members present voted for the motion.

Mr. Jim Elling, 263 Summit Street spoke in support of the salary adjustment for Joan Mullane. Mr. Elling said he felt it would be a great morale booster.

Mr. Dave Elling, 263 Summit Street spoke in favor of providing safe cross walks across Livingston Street.

Mrs. Christine Hageman, 17 Garnett Place addressed the Mayor and Council regarding the dedication of the Blanch Avenue historic sign and informed that the Environmental Commission has written a letter in support of Closter's application to the Bergen County Open Space Trust Fund for money to purchase two acres of property from Mr. David Watkins.


Mr. Jim Elling, 263 Summit Street suggested that the name of Central Woods be "Ferdon Woods" after the slave cemetery that is in the woods.

Mr. Chubby Bocchino, Livingston Street referenced the traffic study and wanted to know if the Borough was going to go with the County's recommendation for an island down the middle of Livingston Street. Mr. Bocchino was informed that the additional traffic study was requested by the County and that it is a count of all cars entering all of the driveways on Livingston Street. No determination has been made as to whether or not islands will be installed or parallel parking will be permitted.

No other member of the public wishing to be heard, a motion to close the meeting to the public was made by Mrs. Senatore, seconded by Mr. Guercio and declared carried upon the affirmative vote of all Council Members present.

At 10:00 PM, a motion was made by Mr. Guercio and seconded by Mr. Scott to adjourn with all Council Members present voting in favor of the motion.

To The Borough of Norwood Mayor and Council:

We, the undersigned residents of the Borough of Norwood, hereby request the Norwood Mayor and Council address the consistent unrest being caused by the Pine Brook Kennel of 39 Broad Street, Norwood, New Jersey.

This dog-boarding business operates seven days a week, 365 days a year. The owner allows the dogs outside at least 3 times a day. These dogs bark loudly without break for long periods of time. The resulting noise is extremely irritating and disturbs the peace of many residents surrounding the kennel. The barking begins very early in the morning, disturbing the peace for all of us who need to sleep. During the day, one can get a migraine simply by sitting outside for ten minutes while these dogs bark.

Borough ordinance chapter 161-1 (prohibited noises) makes unlawful any unnecessary noise or sound on any street of the borough which is physically annoying to persons or which is so harsh or so prolonged as to cause physical discomfort to the lives, health, peace or comfort of any inhabitant of the Borough. Chapter 163-2 was added recently to prohibit excessive noise of landscapers or construction work.

The Council is currently taking steps to minimize the inconvenience of the train horn at the two crossings next to Pine Brook Kennels (Crossing at Blanche Avenue and Broadway). This alone will not satisfy the residents around this kennel. A train horn is inconvenient for less than a minute (15 seconds). Dog barking occurs several times during the day, beginning very early and sometimes even lasting all day. It has become unbearable to us all.

We believe all this noise violates the town noise ordinance. We ask the Norwood Mayor and Council to require the owners of Pine Brook Kennel to find a solution to this problem and allow the residents of this area to experience the peace and quiet we are entitled to.

We greatly appreciate your time and look forward to a positive change.


