

**MINUTES
MAYOR AND COUNCIL
BOROUGH OF NORWOOD
PUBLIC MEETING
October 2, 2007**

The Public Meeting of the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Norwood was held at Borough Hall on the above date.

Mayor Barsa called the meeting to order at 8:00 PM.

Mayor Barsa led the Council and those in attendance in a salute to the American flag and asked for a moment of silence.

Mayor Barsa stated:

“ Adequate notice of this meeting has been provided in accordance with the Open Public Meeting Law, P.L. 1975, Ch. 231, setting forth the time, date, place and purpose of this Public Meeting through a legal notice published in the Press Journal on January 11, 2007, filing a copy in the Borough Clerk’s office and posting on the bulletin board.”

Mayor Barsa pointed out the fire exits.

Public Comment:

It was moved by Mr. Scott and seconded by Mr. Guercio to open the meeting to the public for comment. All Council Members present voted for the motion.

Ms. Teddy Murburg, 300 Piermont Road read a prepared statement regarding the closing of Pascack Valley hospital and requested that the Borough call the Governor’s Office urging that the hospital remain open. Ms. Murburg also requested permission to leave flyers for residents to pick-up regarding sending letters (Attachment “A”). Mayor Barsa expressed his concern regarding the closing of the hospital and urged the residents to call the Governor’s Office. Mr. Brizzolara suggested that the Borough draft a resolution regarding the closing of the hospital.

Public Comment Continued:

Mr. Greg Salerno, 401 D'Ercole Court expressed concern for the residents of Fox Hill with the hospital's closing. Mr. Salerno suggested that the Mayor take the lead with the surrounding towns to petition the State to keep the hospital open. Mayor Barsa informed that he is presently working with the surrounding municipalities for that purpose.

Mr. DeGraaf, 1 Meadow Court spoke regarding a letter he received informing him of the relocation of the stop sign on Meadow Land to Garnett Place. Mr. DeGraaf wanted to know if traffic studies had been done and what the findings of those studies were. He requested that the Mayor and Council shelve this issue until they had time to look into it further.

Ms. Fran Garofalo, 28 Garnett Place explained that she is a 26 year resident of the Borough and the placement of the stop sign will be at the end of her driveway. She is concerned that this will create a safety issue for her. Mayor Barsa explained that residents on Anne Court had requested the relocation of the stop sign to cut down on speeding, but he would have the Borough Engineer look into the matter and report back to the Council.

Mr. DeGraaf, 1 Meadow Court suggested a four-way stop sign and Mrs. Garofalo suggested that it be left alone.

A resident of 10 Meadow Court suggested that the sign be left the way it is and that the Borough should look into the placement of speed bumps in the area.

Mr. Greg Salerno, 401 D'Ercole Court informed that many residents he has met while campaigning have complained about speeding and he suggested that stricter enforcement is necessary. Mayor Barsa explained that he has met with Commissioner Senatore and Chief Krapels to address the speeding issue and the outcome was to assign a traffic officer whose main job is to enforce the traffic laws. In the past week that officer has issued 30 summonses.

Ms. Susan Mirabito, 766 Blanch Avenue addressed the Mayor and Council regarding flooding issues on Blanch Avenue. Ms. Mirabito explained that she was unhappy with the Borough's lack of response to her complaints and that she has addressed these issues with the County Engineer. Ms. Mirabito said that the County is willing to install additional drainage as well as curbing, but they require that the Borough do the necessary engineering including plan design. Ms. Mirabito invited the Mayor and Council to visit her property to see the damage for themselves. After a lengthy discussion, it was agreed that Mayor Barsa and Borough Engineer, Michael Neglia meet with the County to discuss this issue.

Mr. Pete Danielle and Mr. Anthony Plescia, Recreation Director addressed the Mayor and Council regarding the construction of a batting cage at Kennedy Park and the donation of \$7,000 from the Borough that they are looking to obtain. A lengthy discussion took place regarding the cost of the batting cage and the need for public funds to finance the construction.

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Mr. Chubby Bocchino, 455 Livingston Street expressed his concern for traffic on Livingston Street and the many neon signs that he sees in the store windows. Mr. Bocchino wanted to know if neon signs were permitted by ordinance. Mayor Barsa directed Mr. Scott to speak with Mr. Renaud, Zoning Officer regarding this matter.

Mr. Anthony Foschino, 48 Burlington Street wanted to know the status of the complaints he filed regarding the Goddard School and the Ghia Property, specifically the dirt stock piled. Mayor Barsa informed that Mr. Ghia has agreed to have the soil tested. Mr. Foschino also complained about a construction trailer that was recently placed on the property about 1 month ago. Mayor Barsa said he would have the construction official look into it. Mr. Foschino also questioned whether the warehouse on Belden had a Certificate of Occupancy and a Knox Box. Mr. Foschino said that he reviewed the site plan for the Goddard School and he feels that the columns protruding from the building are encroaching onto Penfield Street. Also, Mr. Foschino wanted to know who gave Mr. Ghia permission to maintain the grass on Penfield and whether he has supplied a Certificate of Insurance to the Borough. Mr. Foschino requested that Mr. Ghia be informed that he is to cease cutting the lawn.

No other member of the public wishing to be heard, a motion to close the meeting to the public was made by Mr. Brizzolara, seconded by Mrs. Senatore and declared carried upon the affirmative vote of all Council Members present.

Public Hearing on Ordinance 07:30:

Mayor Barsa stated that he had before him Ordinance 07:30 for Council action entitled:

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND AN ORDINANCE ENTITLED "AN ORDINANCE TO FIX SALARIES, WAGES, AND COMPENSATION OF CERTAIN OFFICIALS, OFFICERS AND EMPLOYEES OF THE BOROUGH OF NORWOOD, COUNTY OF BERGEN, AND STATE OF NEW JERSEY" AND SETTING FORTH THE METHOD OF PAYING SALARIES AND ANY OTHER ORDINANCES AMENDING SAID ORDINANCE

Mr. Brizzolara offered a motion to open the meeting to the public. The motion was seconded by Mr. Scott with all Council Members present voting in favor of the motion. No one wishing to be heard, it was moved by Mr. Scott and seconded by Mr. Guercio to close the meeting to the public. All Council Members present voted in favor of the motion.

Mr. Guercio motioned, seconded by Mr. Brizzolara, that the foregoing Ordinance be adopted. All Council Members present voted in favor of the motion. Mayor Barsa announced that the ordinance was finally adopted and will take effect upon publication in the Press Journal.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Councilman Brizzolara:

Personnel:

Mr. Brizzolara reported that the Personnel Committee is presently interviewing candidates for the position of Assistant CFO and they have narrowed it down to five candidates that they will be calling back for second interviews.

Mr. Brizzolara questioned whether the Borough has received a response from CSX Railroad regarding the Wayside Horns. Mayor Barsa asked the Borough Clerk to call CSX to find out what the hold up is in moving forward with the preliminary engineering study.

Council President Scott:

Mr. Scott had nothing to report at this time.

Councilman Guercio:

Recreation:

Mr. Guercio motioned, seconded by Mrs. Senatore to move forward with appropriating \$7,000.00 to Norwood Baseball for the batting cage. After numerous questions regarding which account the funds would be taken from, it was agreed to have the Borough Attorney review the bond ordinances for possible use. The motion was amended to include Mr. Fede's review and affirmed by all of the Council Members present.

Board of Health:

Mr. Guercio thanked the Board of Health for the wonderful job they do for the Borough and commended the Sanitarian for her hard work and dedication.

Councilwoman Senatore:

Police Department:

Mrs. Senatore thanked Police Officer Julie Santoli for organizing the Movie in the Park night and informed that it was a "Great Success".

Mrs. Senatore read from the Police Department Monthly Report (Attachment "B").

Mrs. Senatore supplied the Council with a handout she had prepared regarding the Board of Health (not attached, none supplied for the record).

Mr. Condoleo reported that there are no irregularities within the 2007 Budget and no problems are anticipated at this time, no departments should go over budget.


General Public Comment:







Incident Frequency by Month (Using DATE RECD)






Weekday vs Weekend



Incident Frequency by TYPE (Top 40 of 114 Shown) (Using DATE RECD)




