REMINDER

FIRST Quarter Property Taxes must be paid no later than February 10, 2016 or a penalty will be assessed. **Please be reminded that we no longer accept cash payments. Checks or money orders only.** If you cannot locate your tax bill, please call the Tax Collector at 201-784-2960.

SNOW STORMS

During snow storms the DPW is out clearing the roads. Please do not park a vehicle or permit a vehicle to remain parked on any street where there is a covering of ice to any thickness or snow to a thickness of one half inch. Any vehicle parked in violation of this restriction may be towed at the owner's expense.

Remember, it is unlawful to cast or plow snow into the street. To keep your driveway clear of snow, place your shoveled snow on the left side of your driveway (when viewed from the street) this way when the plow passes the snow will be pushed away from your driveway not into it.

Homeowners and/or tenants are responsible for clearing snow and ice from sidewalks within twenty-four hours of a storm or within twenty-four hours of ice formation. Residents are requested to keep fire hydrants and catch basins, on or adjacent to their properties, clear of snow and ice. This will aid the Fire Department in the event of an emergency and also prevent flooding.

High blood pressure often shows no signs or symptoms, which is why having your blood pressure checked regularly is important. It's easy to get your blood pressure checked. You can get screened at your doctor's office and drugstores or even check it yourself at home, using a home blood pressure monitor.

SAFE WAYS TO DEAL WITH A SNOWSTORM WHILE DRIVING

Watch TV or listen to the radio for updates on weather conditions. Keep a portable radio, batteries and flashlights handy.

- Keep antifreeze in your car radiator and carry a winter car kit that includes a flashlight, extra batteries, a tow chain or rope, a shovel, a bag of sand or salt, extra mittens, gloves, hats and boots, a windshield scraper, blanket and emergency flares.
- If a blizzard traps you, pull off the highway and stay in your car.
- Do not set out on foot. A building may be too far to walk in deep snow.
- Turn on your hazard lights and hang a cloth or distress flag from the window or antenna.
- If you run your car engine to keep warm, open a window for ventilation.
- Keep snow cleared away from the exhaust pipe and be careful not to use up battery power by balancing the use of your radio, heat and lights.
- In extreme cold weather, use seat covers, floor mats for warmth. Use your coat as a blanket.
